GETTING CHILDREN READY FOR SCHOOL

All children are ready to benefit from a quality kindergarten experience when they are five years old by September 1 of that school year. But kindergarten readiness—the critical stage at which children are prepared for learning and success—is more than a matter of age. For a strong start in school, children need positive relationships and supportive learning environments beginning at birth. At First Steps, we partner with families, caregivers, and communities to ensure that all children are prepared for success.



South Carolina's Profile of the Ready Kindergartner

Developed by SC First Steps and the SC Department of Education, the state's description of school readiness includes 60 developmental milestones across 5 categories:



OUR VISION

Families and early childhood educators are equipped with tools and resources needed to ensure children enter kindergarten ready to succeed.

First Steps 4K provides eligible children with free enrollment in full-day four-year-old kindergarten. In coordination with First Steps local partnerships and more than 250 private, community and faith-based preschool providers, First Steps 4K expands access to quality early education across the state.



ELIGIBILITY

To qualify for enrollment, a child must be:



4 years old on or before September 1

Eligible for Medicaid, SNAP or TANF, experiencing homelessness or transiency, or in foster care

Be a South Carolina resident

2 First Steps 4K providers With First Steps 4K, families are in the driver's seat. They choose the school that best meets their needs. Families can enroll in any participating private, nonprofit, or faith-based preschool provider. The majority of First Steps 4K providers offer an 8 hour instructional day with a year-round calendar, including summers, Through a partnership with SC Voucher, First Steps 4K families can also enroll in the First Steps 4K + Siblings scholarship program which provides whole care and education for all children, ages 0-12, in the household.





EARLY IDENTIFICATION & REFERRAL

an evidence-based program

First Steps' Early Identification and Referral (EI&R) programs serve families with young children with suspected delays in development, acting as a local portal to connect families to community-based services they may need or desire to ensure the school readiness of their children. EI&R services include:



Screenings for children ages 0-5 with suspected delays in development



Referrals, based on screening results, to appropriate resources and support services



Patient information including strategies to monitor growth and development

Early detection of delay is essential to the growing brains of our county's youngest learners. Early Intervention services can change the trajectory of a child's developmental path and improve outcomes for children, families and communities.



NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP

an evidence-based program

Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) helps transform the lives of first-time mothers and their babies. Through ongoing home visits from registered nurses, moms receive the care and support they need to have a healthy pregnancy, provide responsible and competent care for their children, and become more economically self-sufficient. From pregnancy until the child turns two years old, Nurse-Family Partnership Nurse Home Visitors form a much-needed, trusting relationship with their clients, instilling confidence and empowering them to achieve a better life for their children – and themselves.

PARENTS AS TEACHERS

an evidence-based program

Parents as Teachers (PAT) is a home visiting program designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. PAT services include:



Personal visits from a parent educator at least twice monthly



Monthly group connections with other PAT families



Screenings and assessments to identify developmental concerns



Connections to outside resources that families may need to succeed

Raising a Reader helps families develop, practice, and maintain home literacy habits. The program includes a weekly book rotation, parent engagement, literacy experiences, and library connections.

COUNTDOWN TO KINDERGARTEN

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an evidence-informed program

Developed by South Carolina First Steps – and identified as a promising state practice by the National Governor's Association in 2005 – Countdown to Kindergarten (CTK) is a home visitation program pairing the families of rising kindergartners with their future teachers during the summer before school entry. Teachers complete six visits with each family, establishing strong connections during the summer that facilitate classroom learning throughout the year.

Book Flood is a program that fosters a love of reading in both children and parents. Children self-select a high quality, multi-genre book to take home four days a week. This year due to COVID books were only sent home once a week. Each book provides the opportunity for the child and a caregiver to cuddle up and read.


