# OUR OVERARCHING MEASURES OF SUCCESS

#### **INCREASE THE REACH OF FIRST STEPS SERVICES**

By FY25, the percentage of children in need who are directly served by Pickens County First Steps will increase from 37% to 40%.

INCREASE THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN ENROLLED IN HIGH INTENSITY PROGRAMS FUNDED BY FIRST STEPS

By FY25, the percentage of children directly served by high intensity programs funded by Pickens County First Steps will increase from 4% to 6%.

#### **GETTING CHILDREN READY FOR SCHOOL**

All children are ready to benefit from a quality kindergarten experience when they are five years old by September 1 of that school year. But kindergarten readiness—the critical stage at which children are prepared for learning and success—is more than a matter of age. For a strong start in school, children need positive relationships and supportive learning environments beginning at birth. At First Steps, we partner with families, caregivers, and communities to ensure that all children are prepared for success.



#### South Carolina's Profile of the Ready Kindergartner

Developed by SC First Steps and the SC Department of Education, the state's description of school readiness includes 60 developmental milestones across 5 categories:



Approaches to learning & inquiry



**Emotional & social development** 



Physical development, self-help & motor skills



Mathematical thinking



Language & literacy development

### **OUR VISION**

Families and early childhood educators are equipped with tools and resources needed to ensure children enter kindergarten ready to succeed.



### **EARLY IDENTIFICATION & REFERRAL**



First Steps' Early Identification and Referral (EI&R) programs serve families with young children with suspected delays in development, acting as a local portal to connect families to community-based services they may need or desire to ensure the school readiness of their children. EI&R services include:



Screenings for children ages 0-5 with suspected delays in development



Referrals, based on screening results, to appropriate resources and support services



Patient information including strategies to monitor growth and development

Early detection of delay is essential to the growing brains of our county's youngest learners. Early Intervention services can change the trajectory of a child's developmental path and improve outcomes for children, families and communities.



#### NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP



Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) helps transform the lives of first-time mothers and their babies.

Through ongoing home visits from registered nurses, moms receive the care and support they need to have a healthy pregnancy, provide responsible and competent care for their children, and become more economically self-sufficient. From pregnancy until the child turns two years old, Nurse-Family Partnership Nurse Home Visitors form a much-needed, trusting relationship with their clients, instilling confidence and empowering them to achieve a better life for their children – and themselves.

#### **PARENTS AS TEACHERS**



Parents as Teachers (PAT) is a home visiting program designed to build strong communities, thriving families and children who are healthy, safe and ready to succeed. PAT services include:



Personal visits from a parent educator at least twice monthly



Monthly group connections with other PAT families



Screenings and assessments to identify developmental concerns



Connections to outside resources that families may need to succeed

#### **PAT GOES VIRTUAL**

Due to COVID-19, Parents as Teachers (PAT) National provided guidance for affiliates to deliver virtual services via interactive video conferencing and phone calls. South Carolina PAT affiliates rose to the occasion by engaging families in creative and meaningful ways while continuing to meet the Essential Requirements of implementing a quality PAT program during the pandemic.

For many families in Pickens County, the cost of quality childcare is a barrier to financial stability. Our scholarship program makes tuition assistance to childcare providers for children from families who do not quality for SC Vouchers but do not make a livable wage. Our scholarships allow their caregivers to return to school or work.

Pickens County First Steps offers scholarships to families enrolled in any of our programs as well as incomeeligible children whose parent attends school or works at least 20 hours per week.

### FOUR-YEAR OLD KINDERGARTEN



South Carolina First Steps provides eligible children with free enrollment in full-day four-year-old kindergarten. In coordination with First Steps local partnerships and more than 230 private, community and faith-based preschool providers, First Steps 4K expands access to quality early education across the state.



#### **ELIGIBILITY**

To qualify for enrollment, a child must be:



4 years old on or before September 1



Eligible for Medicaid, SNAP or TANF, experiencing homelessness or transiency, or in foster care

## PREPARING FOR STATEWIDE EXPANSION

With First Steps 4K, families are in the driver's seat. They choose the program that best meets their needs. Families can enroll their child in any of the 244 private, nonprofit, or faith-based childcare centers or schools participating in the program. The majority of First Steps 4K providers offer 8-hour day and year-round instruction, including summers, which is at no cost to parents.





### **RAISING A READER**



Raising A Reader is a literacy program where children drive the process and parents learn to and engage in read-aloud strategies. The Raising A Reader program leads to healthy brain development, intrinsic motivation, and improved reading and language outcomes.


